National Careers week is celebrated across the country every year. Colleges, Universities, and Alternative Provisions such as ours, work hard to support young people develop awareness about their future pathways.

Each year education establishments access and utilise resources and a specific assembly provided by National Careers Week, each one with a unique focus, this year being 'Hope', highlighting particular emphasis on normalising worries and stress when it comes to the future.

So, what is hope?

The word hope can have a variety of meanings from one from one person to the next. For myself, hope means looking at what I would like to happen in the future but for you it could mean something very different. It is important we teach our students that being worried about their own future is completely normal and it is a process everyone goes through, being worried and stressed it not always bad, it can often support progress.

All Endeavour Students have access to bespoke careers advice and guidance through timetabled Employability Lessons with Miss Brewer whereby they meet with college representatives, employers and apprentice leads. We are very fortunate to have close working relationships with the Ground Works Team who meet with each young person individually towards the end of the academic year and identify any additional support needs.
